

Texas ranks in the top 10 states with the worst drivers... again

We've all encountered reckless drivers at some point. Texas roads are riddled with them. The high speed limits and lack of regard for public safety have created a culture of risky driving in the Lone Star State. Researchers from the insurance industry have delved deeper into the leading causes of Texas's alarming number of traffic fatalities.

Insurance marketplace site Car Insurance Comparison (CIC) recently drew from national car accident statistics to determine [which states have the worst drivers](#). After reviewing data trends from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and Insurance Information Institute, the study's author ranked the top 10 states with the worst drivers in 2020. Texas tied with Montana at No. 3 and appeared in the top 10 worst drivers list for the ninth year.

The study defines bad drivers as drivers who engage in inconsiderate, risky, or aggressive behavior. The No. 1 most dangerous type of driving behavior ranked by CIC varies between speeding and drunk driving. Both account for more than 30 percent of all traffic fatalities in the United States. According to the study author, both forms of dangerous driving go hand in hand.

Drunk driving accounts for Texas's bleak history of road deaths

The study includes an interactive map displaying Texas's bleak history when it comes to drunk driving fatalities. The Lone Star State ranked No. 1 for having the worst drivers in 2016. At best, the state ranked No. 9 in 2018. The data shouldn't surprise anyone. Texas has consistently remained one of the most dangerous states to drive in for decades. The state's [20-year streak](#) with an average of 10 deaths per day has safety advocates alarmed.

CIC gave each state a best and worst category. Texas's worst category was drunk driving. The study based its findings on the number of drunk driving fatalities in Texas during 2018. That year, nearly 46 percent of all traffic fatalities in Texas involved a drunk driver. In addition, drunk driving fatalities in Texas accounted for nearly 16 percent of all [drunk driving fatalities nationwide](#).

Texas has the highest speed limits in the U.S., with speed limits reaching 85 mph on some roadways. Ironically, the state's best category was speeding, which accounted for more than 27 percent of traffic fatalities in 2018.

Drunk driving often goes hand in hand with speeding. That's because the lack of good judgment caused by alcohol impairment makes drunk drivers unaware of how fast they're traveling. Additionally, they often fail to stop or slow down before a crash due to delayed reaction time and reduced coordination. Many full-speed drunk driving crashes also happen when impaired drivers fall asleep at the wheel.
